FORMATION OF INTER-AGENCY COORDINATING COMMITTEE (IACC)

Objectives

This circular is to inform the industry on the formation of the Inter-Agency Coordinating Committee (IACC) to facilitate the resolution of conflicting regulatory requirements/policies encountered in construction activities and projects.

Role and Organisation of the IACC

2 Formerly known as the Inter-Department Coordinating Committee (IDCC), the committee is revamped and officially renamed as the Inter-Agency Coordinating Committee (IACC) in July 2011. The new IACC led by BCA, will look into conflicting regulatory requirements by different agencies encountered in projects, as well as conflicting policies implemented by agencies, which have an impact on construction productivity. The IACC would serve as a platform to enable speedy resolution of such issues and problems. For project teams that encounter problems in meeting requirements imposed by only one regulating agency, it would be more expedient that they approach the imposing agency directly for resolution.

Procedures for Tabling of Issues/Problems due to Conflicting Policies or Regulatory Requirements

4 Any project team may table the issues for IACC's attention and follow up when they encounter issues or problems due to conflicting policies/regulatory requirements implemented by regulatory authorities in construction activities and projects.

5 The requestor may submit the request in writing through email, fax or post to the IACC Secretariat. The request should include the following basic information:

- a) Name and designation/role of requestor;
- b) Requestor's organisation/firm;
- c) Contact number and email address;
- d) Project description (if applicable); and
- e) Description of conflicting policies/rules concerned.
