LODGEMENT SCHEME FOR STREET PLAN SUBMISSION ON LANDED HOUSING DEVELOPMENT NOT AFFECTED BY ROAD RESERVE

- 1. In our continuous effort to streamline and facilitate approval procedures, we would be implementing the lodgement scheme for street plan submission on landed housing development not affected by road widening line with effect from 1 April 2004.
- 2. Under the scheme, a Professional Engineer (PE) will prepare the street plans in accordance with the Street Works Act and its Regulations, and declare compliance with the Street Works Act and its Regulations when he lodges the street plans with LTA. LTA will acknowledge receipt of the lodgement by issuing an acknowledgement letter.
- 3. The lodgement shall be made on Form LTA/RT/BP-3. A copy of the Lodgement Form is enclosed for your reference. The lodgement scheme is not applicable for Street Plan comprising the following:
 - a. New street submitted under Section 18 of the Street Works Act;
 - b. Road widening plot;
 - c. New traffic scheme;
 - d. Amendment to existing traffic scheme; and/or
 - e. Relocation of existing traffic signs, street lighting, existing sign posts, existing road humps and commuter facility.
- 4. Please note that prior to the lodgement of the street plans, the development proposal must have obtained LTA's Development Control Clearance & the Written Permission granted by the Competent Authority, URA. Application for clearance of certificate of statutory completion is required, upon completion of the street works based on the lodged street plans. A flow chart is attached in Annex A for your reference.

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

- 1. The architect shall concurrently submit to URA to obtain the Written Permission (WP) on the proposal.
- 2. Before PE lodges Street Plan with DBC (LTA), he shall ensure the followings are complied with:
 - a. The lodgement is within the criteria as stipulated in the lodgement Form LTA/RT/BP-3.
 - b. The lodgement Form LTA/RT/BP-3 is duly completed and endorsed.
 - c. A copy of the Written Permission granted by URA is attached with the lodgement Form LTA/RT/BP-3.
 - d. The Street Plans are endorsed by PE.
 - e. The proposal layout including the access arrangement is the same as the approved DC plan submitted by the architect.
- 3. The PE to comply with the following when he applies for CSC clearance:
 - a. Submit a copy of the Certificate of Supervision certifying that the works completed are according to the approved plan.
 - b. All damages are rectified and debris removed.
